SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY FAIR MAY 24-26, 2025 AND MAY 31-JUNE 1, 2025

THE COUNTDOWN HAS BEGUN!

April 13th is the deadline to register your submissions for the San Bernardino County Fair. This doesn't mean that you need to have all of your projects completed by this date. Think about what you might reasonably complete by the time you must physically submit your projects to the Fair (April 28th or 29th) and register those pieces. The cost per piece to register is \$2.00. What a deal! Any project finished since June 2019 is eligible. Remember, too, that all participants will receive a chance to win a \$50 gift certificate for EVERY piece submitted this year! We will do the drawing on the last day of the Fair.

You don't need to be a resident of San Bernardino County to enter either. ALL of our members are invited to join in the fun! If you don't reside in a neighboring County, contact me and I'll share with you what to do. As always if you are unable to physically come to the Fair to drop off and pick up your submissions, let me know. I will be happy to do this for you. You have a few options – 1) bring them to my home in Apple Valley, 2) have a friend bring them for you, 3) drop them off at O'Flanary's in Redlands, or 4) mail them to me. Please make certain to include a list of the items you are entrusting to us so that they are all returned safely to you.

Painters of all levels are invited to participate. I've heard our newer painters say, "I don't paint that well." Let me address that. First, each division competes against painters of similar skill levels, and second, we all started out as beginners. For the past two years, we haven't had any entries for Beginners which is why we need you! This coming year, painters who have traditionally entered in the Intermediate division are moving on to Advanced, so, we especially need members who have less than 1-10 years of experience to join in. I know you're out there!

So, Happy Painting! Let's have an even greater showing for 2025!

Fairgrounds

San Bernardino County Fair is located in Victorville, off 7th Street, east of the 15 Freeway. Our address is: 14800 7th Street, Victorville, CA 92395.

Fair dates and Times

The 2025 78th Annual San Bernardino County Fair will be held

Saturday, May 24th through Monday, May 26th and Friday, May 30th through Sunday, June 1st.

Gates are open 2—10 p.m.,

Closing hours for the exhibit buildings will be 9 p.m. daily unless otherwise authorized.

State Rules

All local and State Rules, Health Rules and Score Cards for judging, as prescribed by the Division of Fairs and Expositions, apply to all entries of this Fair. State Rules can be found on-line at www.cdfa.ca.gov. All State Rules for California Fairs apply to the event and will be strictly enforced. Check with each department you wish to enter for specific entry form instructions and guidelines. Please see that each requirement has been complied with to avoid possible premium disallowances. Entries will be accepted in the "Any other" or "Miscellaneous" classes only when the item or article represents a substantial difference from the classes offered. In all departments the Fair Management reserves the right to limit entries to the available space in the facility and may limit the number of entries made by an Exhibitor. Any return of entries under this rule will be made generally and without discrimination.

Entrance Requirements

All competitive entry divisions are open to all residents of San Bernardino County and to residents of adjacent counties. See each department's guidelines and entry qualifications.

Entry Form Deadlines

All Entries MUST be done online. No paper entry forms will be accepted.

The deadline for Competitive Entries is Sunday, April 11, 2025

Entry Fees

Entry fees, unless noted, for Adult Divisions are \$2.00 per entry and Youth Divisions are \$1.00 per entry. Entry fees will be forfeited on entries not exhibited.

Exhibitor's Responsibility

Exhibitor's acknowledge the acceptance of the guidelines, rules and regulations governing the San Bernardino County Fair as printed in the Official Exhibitor's Handbook and the California Division of Fairs and Expositions State Rules, once an online entry is processed and paid for. Any person who violates any General, State or Department Rule will forfeit all privileges and premiums.

Sale of Exhibit

The Fair will not permit the sale of any exhibit or any part of an exhibit.

Exhibits Arrival - Fairgrounds

Please see our Schedule of Events for arrival dates/times. If you are in doubt as to the division or class your entry belongs, please call the entry office (760) 951-2200.

Exhibit Releases

Exhibitors must have Claim Check Stub (which was given on receiving day), in order for your exhibits to be released by the Department Chairperson or Fair Management. All exhibits released on Monday, June 2, 2025 from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m..

All items not picked up within **10 days** of the closing date of the 2024 San Bernardino County Fair will become the Fair's property and will be disposed of at the discretion of the Fair Management.

Non-Liability of Association

Entries are made at Exhibitor's risk. A thorough system of security supervision will be maintained. The Fair Management AS-SUMES NO RESPONSIBILITY for loss, injury or damage done to or occasioned by, or arising from any animal or article exhibited by him/her, and shall indemnify the 28th District Agricultural Association against all legal proceedings in regard thereto. Presentation of entry form shall be deemed acceptance of this rule. Exhibitor will provide own exhibit insurance.

General Information & Local Rules

Please read Very Carefully as some very important changes have been made

Decorations

All decorative material must be FLAME PROOF in accordance with requirements of the State Fire Marshal. Com stalks, hay and/or other dry decorative material must be treated with an approved retardant preparation.

Safety

The San Bernardino County Fair will take reasonable precautions to ensure the safety of exhibits and property of every description entered for competition or display or any other purpose while anywhere on the Fairgrounds. In no case will the 28th District Agricultural Association be responsible for any loss, damage or injury of any character, to any property, article or person, while on the 28th District Agriculture Association Fairground.

Cancellation of Exhibit Privileges

The Management reserves the right to refuse, accept and/or cancel entries, disqualify exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, or cancel awards without claim for damages.

Interpretation of Rules and Protests etc.

The Management reserves the final and absolute right to interpret all local rules and regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regards thereto, and also reserves the right to amend and add to the local rules. State Rule interpretation is solely at the discretion of the California Department of Food and Agriculture, Division of Fairs & Expositions. The San Bernardino County Fair will enforce State Rules as written.

Premium Checks

Placement of ribbons does not guarantee correct placing by the judges. Only the official placing on the certified judging sheets constitutes the final placement. All premium money will be paid from the official judging sheet results and not from ribbons or awards that may be attached to the exhibit. The Fair does not guarantee additional payment from sponsors. These prizes are typically secured by the Fair with a promissory statement from the sponsor in good faith and if not received the Fair is not responsible for payment. Premium scales are listed in each Department. Ribbons, tags and cards have no value as payment. ONLY THE OFFICIAL PLACING ON THE JUDGING SHEET CONSTITUES THE FINAL PLACEMENT.

*Important Premium Pay-Out Information— Premium and cash awards for Competitive Exhibits will be issued in person by a staff member from the Competitive Exhibits Office. Exhibitors that earned premiums and cash awards will pick them up after picking up their items on Pick-Up Day, Monday, June 2nd with ID and/or claim checks to claim their monies. On Tuesday, June 3rd through Thursday, June 5th you will come to the Main Office, located in the Fairgrounds main office, to pick up your money. Cash awards will be paid out Monday, June 2nd from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. and Tuesday, June 3rd through Thursday, June 5th from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. only. Cash awards not claimed by June 5, 2025 at 3 p.m. will be forfeited by the exhibitor.

Judging Systems

AMERICAN: The judging process which ranks exhibits against one another and awards one 1ST place award, one 2ND place award, etc.

DANISH: The judging process which compares each exhibit on its own merit against the scorecard or recognized standard and awards as many first place awards, second place awards, etc., as merited.

Best of Show

Best of show will be selected from first place entries only.

AMATEUR: A person who engages in an event or activity as a pastime rather than a profession.

- No Entry Limits.
- Each article entered must be the entire workmanship of the entrant and have been finished since June 2019.
- · All entries must have a finish on all sides, except fabric.
- Definitions: for the purpose of choosing the right class for entry, please use the following definitions as a guide.

<u>Novice</u> - beginners, students or hobbyists who have painted 1 to 5 years. <u>Intermediate</u> - students or hobbyists who have painted 6 to 10 years.

Advanced #1- students or hobbyists who are knowledgeable in the Art and have painted for 11 to 15 years.

Advanced #2/Professional - A person who have been doing Art for 16 or more years OR Teachers/someone working at this as a livelihood rather than a hobby.

Folk Art - Painting done on any surface in a non-realistic style

Rosemaling/Stroke work - Painting done on any surface using basic brush strokes in various combinations to complete the design.

Realistic - painting done on any surface in realistic style.

Fabric - painting done on any fabric with acrylic or fabric dye.

SPRING IS IN THE AIR! Heidi painted this wonderful spring design on a 4"x12" (2 pieces) piece of wood that she attached to a 17" tall tin half round bin with double stick tape. Both the wood and tin are available for purchase at O'Flanary's. Of course you can paint on any surface of your choice. How To Register For This Class

Braided Easter Bread

This Easter bread makes a beautiful centerpiece for your holiday table. The braided dough is decorated with whole eggs that bake along with the bread. For extra color, you can dye the whole eggs before baking.

Prep Time: 40 mins Cook Time: 35 mins

Additional Time: 1 hr 55 mins Total Time: 3 hrs 10 mins

Servings: 10

Yield: 1 (1-pound) loaf

Ingredients

3 cups all-purpose flour, divided

1/4 cup white sugar

1 teaspoon salt

1 (.25 ounce) package active dry yeast

⅔ cup milk

2 tablespoons butter

2 large eggs

5 large whole eggs, dyed if desired

2 tablespoons butter, melted

Directions

Step 1

Gather the ingredients.

Step 2

Stir 1 cup flour, sugar, salt, and yeast together in a bowl until well combined.

Step 3

Heat milk and 2 tablespoons butter in a small saucepan over medium-low heat until milk is warm and butter is softened but not melted, 2 to 3 minutes.

Gradually add milk mixture to flour mixture, stirring constantly. Add $\frac{1}{2}$ cup flour and two eggs; mix until well combined. Add remaining 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups flour in three batches, stirring well after each addition, until dough pulls together. Turn out onto a lightly floured surface and knead until smooth and elastic, about 8 minutes.

Step 5

Place dough into a lightly oiled bowl; turn to coat all sides. Cover with a damp cloth and let rise in a warm place until doubled in volume, about 1 hour.

Step 6

Punch down dough, then turn out onto a lightly floured surface. Divide in half and gently form into rounds; cover and let rest for 10 minutes. Meanwhile, butter a baking sheet.

Step 7

Roll each dough round into a 36-inch-long roll about 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches thick. Twist dough loosely and form into a ring on the prepared baking sheet, leaving five spaces for eggs.

Step 8

Seal the ends of the ring together, and set whole eggs into the spaces in the dough. Cover loosely with a damp towel and let rise in a warm place until doubled in volume, about 45 minutes.

Step 9

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Brush risen loaf with melted butter. Bake in the preheated oven until golden brown, about 30 minutes.

Step 10

Enjoy!
